- 1. To qualify for a fee exemption, students are advised to submit their thesis early, preferably one week before the stipulated Sunday deadline. This allows sufficient time for the Department Administrator and Thesis Advisor to review and process the thesis, ensuring that the <u>endorsement</u> date (by the Thesis Advisor) occurs within the Instructional Week 2 of the semester.
- 2. To encourage graduate research students to submit their thesis promptly, those who do so after Instructional Week 2, but by end September in Semester 1, or end March in Semester 2, would receive a half semester tuition fee refund.
- 3. The fee refund is not applicable for <u>miscellaneous fees.</u>
- 4. Research students (non-scholars) who submit their thesis for examination during the semester when they are on leave of absence (LOA) or during the semester immediately after the period of leave, will have to pay fees (tuition and miscellaneous) for one semester, even if the thesis is submitted within Instructional Week 2 or the first half of the latter semester.
- 5. Research scholars whose research scholarship have expired and have not submitted their thesis are no longer eligible for tuition fee allowance. They are required to pay their own fees with effect from the current semester (if the last day of scholarship is within the first two instructional weeks of the current semester) or with effect from the subsequent semester (if the last day of scholarship is beyond the second instructional week of the current semester). Fees are payable until the thesis is submitted for examination.
